THE REAL ESTATE CORNER



Oslo, Norway-headquartered oil and gas supplier, SLB OneSubsea, has announced the construction of a new 24,000-square-foot building at its complex found at 7611 Lake Road South inside Theodore Industrial Park. The development will enable Primo, a Denmark-based plastic profile manufacturer, to supply polyvinyl chloride (PVC) profiles for subsea cables a key component of the SLB OneSubsea umbilical design. The \$5.8-million facility is expected to create 12 new jobs in the region and further strengthen the industrial ecosystem supporting the oil and gas sector. "The collaboration for the PVC profile extrusion facility marks an important step in Primo's expansion into the U.S. market," PrimoCEO Claus Tønnesen said.

In an update, plans are still on track for Arcelor Mittal to begin building its \$1.2-billion advanced non-grain-oriented electrical steel manufacturing facility in Calvert starting sometime during summer of this year. The new project is anticipated to spin off over 1,300 local construction jobs during its build-out phase, and more than 200 permanent on-site

positions will support the plant's ongoing operations after completion. The development has been heralded by many local experts as a transformative event that will strengthen the local economy and reinforce Mobile County's role as a major regional player in sustainable steel production and electric vehicle manufacturing. The site will reportedly be capable of producing up to 150,000 metric tons of steel per year at peak capacity and production lines begin rolling by 2027.

An indoor pickleball facility, PickleRage, is tentatively scheduled to open this May in West Mobile near University Boulevard inside the Regency Square Shopping Center. It will occupy the old Lagniappe Home Store building and the 43,000-square-foot space will feature 12 indoor CushionX courts used by professionals. Amenities will include a fully stocked pro shop, a lounge, a party room, locker rooms and showers. PickleRage will also offer lessons from area professional players, along with the ability to reserve courts in advance. Local business partners Jonathan Keith and Mark Howard are co-owners of the new venture.

Locally owned boutique staffing and employment firm, Fit Recruiting, held a grand opening at its new 2,200-square-foot office last month located at 2602 Dauphin Street. The 13-year-old local company specializes in providing skilled professionals across multiple industries, including accounting, information technology, office administration and executive searches.

In February Baptist Children's Homes moved to a new 4,500 square-feet of office space located at 1400 Montlimar Drive in West Mobile. Jill Meeks and Steadman Bethea with Stirling Properties handled the lease transaction.


