# LUNCHEON SPEAKER

Currently serving as the Aviation Information System Program Manager at the USCG Aviation Training Center, Lieutenant Lobmeyer is a Class of 2016 United States Coast Guard Academy graduate where he earned a B.S. in Government, with a focus in Security Studies. While



there he was a member of the football and wrestling teams, and served as the Regimental Workplace Climate Officer where he authored the Shore Patrol Program to provide safe travel arrangements to cadets while on liberty after hours which is still in use today. Following graduation, he reported to Naval Flight Training where he would earn his Wings of Gold in 2018.

As a first tour aviator, Lieutenant Lobmeyer reported to Air Station Cape Cod to fly the HC-144A Ocean Sentry. While stationed in the Coast Guard's First District, Lieutenant Lobmeyer quickly upgraded to Aircraft Commander and executed 26 Search and Rescue cases: saving 26 lives. One particularly challenging case involved a distressed sailboat 330 nautical miles offshore in severe weather, for which he and his crew were awarded the 2019 Elmer Stone Award for USCG Search and Rescue case of the year. It was during this tour, he began working towards qualifying as an Air Operations Branch Director with deployments to Hurricanes

FLORENCE, DORIAN, and HUMBERTO. He also was an active member in the community as the head coach of a youth wrestling team of over 100 children, which provided opportunity to the isolated community that had no youth programs available.

In Summer of 2022, Lieutenant Lobmeyer reported to the Aviation Training Center as a member of the Operations Department. He quickly established himself in the Safety Department as the Ground Safety Officer, managing 27 safety programs and processing all ground mishaps. Since reporting, he qualified as an Air Operations Branch Director and has been called on to respond to six Type 1 incidents to include Hurricanes IAN, IDALIA, DEBBY, HELENE, MILTON and as the first underway Air Boss for Operation Vigilant Sentry. He was also selected by Admiral Lafferty to serve as a Core Team Member of the Commandant's Accountability and Transparency Review Team, following the Operation Fouled Anchor investigation.

After receiving a full tuition grant from the National Institute of Occupational Safety, he is projected to finish his Master of Engineering degree in Industrial Safety Systems and Ergonomics from Auburn in 2026. He has submitted for a Type 1 Air Operations Branch Director qualification, which if awarded would make him the first USCG Lieutenant to ever receive the international designation.

The Mobile County Sheriff's Office is the second largest in the state, with a staff of over 600 serving more than 400,000 citizens across an area of some 1,200 square miles.

The Sheriff's Office serves through four divisions: administrative services, field operations, support services and correction. Our correction division which operates the Mobile Metro Jail, has an average daily population of some 1500. In order to best fight crime while saving taxpayers

millions of dollars, the Sheriff's Office also administers a 325-bed minimum security barracks that houses prisoners who are put to work in order to earn their keep.

The fight against crime requires constant updates of technology, from text-based citizen reporting methods to Smart Policing. This concept utilizes crime analysis in order to identify trends and crime "hot spots" in order to best allocate resources.


Tinsel Takedown: A Festive Christmas Tree Decorating Contest Supporting the SWMCC's Christmas Giveback Campaign

# THE REAL ESTATE CORNER



Last month, U.S. Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg; Federal Railroad Administrator Amit Bose; Mayor Sandy Stimpson and other dignitaries attended a groundbreaking ceremony marking the start of the Gulf Coast Corridor Improvement project in Downtown Mobile. The initiative will restore Amtrak service from New Orleans to Mobile, a corridor that has not had passenger service since the devastation of Hurricane Katrina in 2005. CSX will add a layover track so passenger trains do not impede freight operations at

the Port of Mobile. Amtrak will also build a new passenger platform on the site of its old stage at Cooper Riverside Park. The route will have daily stops in New Orleans, Gulfport, Bay St. Louis, Pascagoula, Biloxi and Mobile. Timelines for completion were unannounced at the event.

Sioux Falls, South Dakota-based aerospace repair provider, Aerostar, recently announced a \$4.7-million expansion of its site at the Mobile Aeroplex in Brookley. The expansion is expected to add upwards of 50 new jobs over the next three years for a total of 110 employees. Aerostar's investment will support growth of the aerospace aftermarket sector. The new test equipment will support specialized repair services for hydraulic, pneumatic and electromechanical aircraft components used in commercial airlines. Construction is currently underway, with operations planned to begin by September 2025.

Last month Governor Kay Ivy, CSX and Scannell Properties held a groundbreaking that announced the Platinum CSX Select Site designation for RailPort Logistics Mobile, a 500+acre industrial park in Theodore. In the initial phase, Scannell will focus developing nine industrial buildings, four of which will have rail service by CSX. Additional plans include investing \$15 million for transportation infrastructure upgrades benefitting the neighboring Todd Acres Industrial Park.

The space formerly occupied by iconic Mobile eatery Spot of Tea, located at 310 Dauphin Street in Downtown Mobile, was bought last month by a local investor for \$1.29 million. The new owner plans to renovate the 1836 Zoghby-Moore building for a future development. Mary Daffin of IXL Real Estate worked for the buyer and David Kahalley of Shamrock Properties in Daphne represented the seller on the deal.

Carter's, a popular apparel brand for toddlers and babies, leased a 3,924-square-foot retail space at McGowin Park in West Mobile. Martin Smith and Cooper Smith of SRS Real Estate Partners' Birmingham office represented the landlord. Buff Teague of JLL worked for Carter's in the transaction.

Local developers are seeking planning approval to build the Colony Woods Townhomes on 8 acres in the 600 block of Dawes Road and D.R. Horton plans to develop the nearby Anglebrook subdivision with 108 lots on almost 40 acres at 2301 McFarland Road in West Mobile.


