John Terzo is the Site Leader/General Manager of the Amazon Sort Center in Theodore, Alabama and has been with the company for 2.5yrs. After completing his MBA from Vanderbilt University he was recruited by Amazon to open the sort center in November of 2017. The sort center was a strategic addition for the Amazon fulfillment network to serve the gulf coast region as well as rural areas within Louisiana and Mississippi. The sort center, known as MOB5, is an operations leader in the sort center network for Amazon and often used as a benchmark for other sites. BUSINESS INSIGHT



It always surprises me when I meet someone, ask about their job, and immediately their brain kind of seizes up. If this is you, we are here to help. This month's article will give you some of the things we take into consideration when putting together an elevator pitch for clients.

An elevator pitch is meant to be 20-30 seconds and should highlight what your organization does in such a persuasive way that it creates interest in the person you are talking to. As an example, I typically say something along the lines of:

Blue Fish is an Advertising Agency based out of Mobile Alabama that helps small and medium-sized organizations overcome obscurity and connect with their audience. We know that clients cannot purchase from you if they do not know you exist. Blue Fish is a data-driven agency that uses social media management, social media ads, websites, videography, photography, branding, and graphic design to get results for our clients.

We are going to assume you've already created user personas after we talked about them in Article #1. If not, you'll want to picture your ideal customer, give them a name, give them a face, write down anything that helps you define and imagine this individual. This is all going to help you in creating an elevator pitch. You'll be able to better define what they like or dislike and what they might respond to.

You'll also want to make a list of the top 4-5 things you do for people. Use language that they understand. Do NOT use technical or industry jargon. You want to be able to break down what you do in such a way that even your parents can understand it.

Probably the most important aspect of an elevator pitch is the Unique Selling Proposition (USP). A USP is something that sets you apart from your competitors and makes the person remember you. It might be a focus that you have, or a specific technology, or the speed with which you operate. Anything that you can say that makes them remember you is great, and bonus points if it is something that they can immediately think "I need that".

Make sure to time yourself stating the pitch. You don't want to assume you are under 30 seconds only to drone on for 60. Play around with it a little bit as well. Play with words. Play with the order of services. Figure out what feels right.

OUTSTANDING OFFICER OF THE MONTH

He was presented with the award at the SouthWest Mobile County Chamber's monthly business luncheon on October 2, 2019. Cpl. Goodman's hard work is greatly appreciated. His dedication and exemplary contribution is gratefully acknowledged.

REAL ESTATE CORNER BY RON SIVAK

General management and promotion for the **Mobile International Speedway**, located at **7800 Park Blvd.** in **Irvington**, was recently handed off to **Jason Smith**. He is a former racecar driver, racing promoter and current 21-year Firefighter EMT veteran based out of Gulfport, Mississippi.

Originally built in **1965** by local investor **Walter "Skip" Wetjen**, the raceway blossomed when acquired in **1970** by former wrestling champion and 20-year owner of **Gulf Coast Wrestling Association, Lee Fields**. His stewardship of the Mobile International Speedway for 28 years, before his death in 2000, saw its rise to national prominence.

After Field's passing his widow, **Ida Fields**, hired a succession of race management service groups to promote the raceway, the most recent being Rossville, Georgia-based **Lyons Motorsports**.

Smith took over a raceway seeing shrinking attendance evaporating revenues. To date, he has invested upwards of \$75,000 in upgrades. One competitive event coming back is the "Lee Fields Classic" race being held November 1st and 2nd of this year.

"My dad raced at the track in the 1980's and I grew up watching him. I raced there competitively in the 1990's," Smith said. "The Lee Field's race is the only annual event in the county that awards prize money and a wrestling belt. Mr. Fields did a fantastic job putting Irvington on the map for NASCAR and ARCA sponsored events."

Marcus & Millichap recently announced the sale of a **Take 5 Oil Change** franchise, located at **3949 Airport Blvd.** in Mobile, for **\$1.292 million**. The property includes a **1,980 square foot** service building that sits on **.65 acres** of land, according to **Joseph W. McKibben**, regional manager of the Mobile office.

Andrew Chason and **Preston Cooper** listed the space for the seller (a private investor) and located the buyer. Operations at the quick lube space will continue uninterrupted.

Marietta Urquhart with **White-Spinner Realty** recently reported the sale of a former sign shop, located at **4314 Halls Mill Road**, to **Mobile Fence Company Inc.** **David Cooper** with **Berkshire Hathaway** worked for the buyer in the transaction.

The site sits on about **an acre** of property and is located near **Crown Auto Body**. Parts of the building have been leased out before and could be open for lease again, per Urquhart, who represented the seller in the transaction.

Brick & Spoon will be opening its **second Mobile location**, having leased **3,200 square feet** of space in **Westwood Plaza at Airport Boulevard** and **Schillinger Road**. Currently under renovation, expectations are for the new eatery to open sometime by the end of this year.

Kenny Nichols with **Vallas Realty** represented the landlord. **Chris Harle** of **White-Spinner Realty** worked for the tenant.

COASTAL 150 UPDATE

In March, the Trump Administration unveiled dramatic changes to the way the National Flood Insurance Program charges homeowners for flood risks, a move that will affect insurance bills for millions of Americans across the country.

The initiative, which FEMA calls Risk Rating 2.0, comes as climate change places growing pressure on the publicly subsidized flood insurance program. Claims often outpace premiums, saddling the program with a debt that topped \$30 billion in 2017. The models that determine those rates ignore certain kinds of flooding, such as intense rainfall. And many Americans at risk of flooding nonetheless don't buy insurance. Risk Rating 2.0, is intended to modernize a system that has gone largely unchanged since the 1970s.

The revamp, which will begin to go into effect October 2020 for single family homes, could lead to higher flood insurance rates for some homeowners and lower costs for others, depending on a range of new data points that officials say will provide a more accurate picture of potential perils facing individual properties.

For the first time, FEMA will incorporate into its flood insurance rates the cost of rebuilding a structure, which officials said would address an inequity where lower-value homes have paid the same rates as higher-priced homes.

All 5 million of the program's policyholders will see different rates under the new system, FEMA has said and the updated methodology "will affect all of them differently."

Information used to determine the new rates will include property-specific information, such as distance to the coast or other water source, exposure to different types of flood risk, and cost to rebuild the home, among others. All existing statutory and regulatory requirements, including rate caps on premium increases, will remain in effect; but in the end, some rates will go up, and some will go down.

A likely scenario could be as follows: Two homes are located in a 100-year flood plain. The first home sits at the landward edge of the zone and faces a low risk from inland flooding and/or storm surge. The second home, located closer to the flooding source, faces a higher risk from both outcomes.

Under the current system, each home owner would pay the same premium regardless of relative flood risks. Under Risk Rating 2.0, the first home owner will likely see their premium fall and the second home owner will face a premium hike. Because the program is still under development, however, it is uncertain how any given property might be affected.

The initiative poses political risks for the Trump administration, which is overhauling the dominant source of financial protection against flooding for millions of Americans.

Lawmakers from both parties have intervened in recent years to stop flood insurance rate hikes that threatened to rattle local real estate markets. Members of the House and Senate are already pledging close scrutiny of the plans being rolled out by FEMA.

With some homeowners set to see higher rates, FEMA said it is

evaluating ways to minimize financial burden and unintended harm, such as through a phased-in approach to transition policyholders to the new system. Congress has already set limits on how much FEMA can increase premiums.

The politics of the flood insurance program are regional rather than partisan, and affordability concerns can quickly unite lawmakers -- a dynamic that will be front and center as Congress scrutinizes FEMA's new risk rating program.
