

GUEST SPEAKER MAYOR SANDY STIMPSON

The City of Mobile's 108th Mayor, Sandy Stimpson, has a bold mission for Mobile's citizens to become One Mobile – a safer, more business and family friendly city.

Driven by a desire to affect positive change in the life of each citizen, Mayor Stimpson has proven that the greatest level of success is achieved when everyone has a seat at the table. Stimpson's four decades of experience in the private sector and extensive community service provide a solid foundation for the type of practical change he has generated in just seven years in office. Mayor Stimpson has ushered in a new culture at City Hall, emphasizing a commitment to transparency, effectiveness and efficiency.

Since assuming office in 2013, Mayor Stimpson's tenure has been marked by major achievements that stand to make a lasting impact for all citizens. Stimpson and his team have executed such transformative initiatives as Map for Mobile, an unprecedented increase in the delivery of infrastructure improvements, and the city's first supplier diversity program.

Mayor Stimpson's leadership has led to unparalleled reform of city finances.

Stimpson and his team built upon responsible fiscal stewardship to put the city on sound financial footing, reducing bonded indebtedness by nearly \$100 million, and unfunded liabilities for pension and benefits by \$200 million, leading to credit rating increases from both Moody's and S&P. A graduate from the University of Alabama in 1975 with a bachelor's degree in civil engineering, Stimpson began a nearly 40-year career in his family's lumber manufacturing business. Starting at an early age, he worked his way up through virtually every position in the family business including serving as its CFO and ultimately it's Executive Vice President.

Mayor Sandy Stimpson and his wife Jean have been married since 1975 and have four grown, married children and 14 grandchildren. They are longtime, active members of Ashland Place United Methodist Church.

Times are tough right now for a lot of businesses. And when money gets tight, many businesses start cutting expenses like advertising. Henry Ford is quoted as saying “A man who stops advertising to save money is like a man who stops a clock to save time.”

These are just a few ideas to get you started. Don't lose sight of the fact that a business needs to continually increase the number of people that know about them. This is the first part of getting someone to do business with you, they have to know about you. If you are a new business, doing so will increase the chances that you quickly get to the minimum number of customers you need in order to survive. If you have been in existence for some time, it increases the volume of customers you have which will increase your revenue. So there really is no downside to advertising if you do it right. As I always say, advertising should be an investment in your business, not an expense.

COASTAL 150 UPDATE

Amazon Defeats Union Organizing in Alabama, Igniting the Labor Debate in Congress, and Putting a Target on Right to Work States

Recently, Amazon employees in Bessemer, Alabama, voted not to unionize, handing the tech giant a victory in its biggest battle yet against labor-organizing efforts in more than a decade. Amazon's victory in last month's union vote in Bessemer was either a crushing defeat for organized labor in America or the first step in a continuing campaign to change future unionizing efforts at other manufacturing and distribution facilities in the southeast.

According to the results of the vote count, only about 12.5% of the eligible workers at Amazon's Bessemer fulfillment center actually voted to unionize with the Retail, Wholesale & Department Store Union, even after a mail-in election period that lasted for almost two months. That showing also came after weeks of national media coverage and public shows of support including visits by five Democratic Representatives, as well as Sen. Bernie Sanders (I-Vt.), and went all the way to President Joe Biden.

But the Bessemer vote could signal a change in tactics for union organizers around the country, so do not expect this topic to fade into the background anytime soon.

Union officials and their supporters — who plan to challenge the results and ask the National Labor Relations Board to consider setting the vote aside — are seizing on their loss as the impetus for enacting the House Passed Protecting the Right to Organize Act (PRO Act), Democrats' pro-union labor overhaul that would make it easier for workers to form and join unions.

This legislation includes provisions that would eliminate right-to-work protections, right to a secret ballot in union elections, allow unions to access personal employee information in union-organizing drives, and force workers to pay union dues even if they do not support the union. The PRO Act would also expand the definition of what an employee is and allow for more strikes while making it harder for employers to replace striking workers. Enacting those changes might reverse years of declining union membership. Private sector union membership stood at 6.3 percent of the U.S. workforce in 2020, according to the National Labor Relations Board.

It's unlikely that the act will pass through the divided Senate without Democrats first eliminating the

filibuster, an act that requires 60 votes to invoke cloture on legislative matters and prevents parties with a small majority from voting partisan bills into action. But in Washington, D.C., this union defeat is catching the attention of many in Congress and the Biden Administration. "Without knowing it, Amazon is igniting a movement to pass the PRO Act and return workers in Alabama, Michigan and all corners of this land to their rightful place as drivers of broadly shared prosperity that represents America at its best," Rep. Andy Levin (D-Mich.) said.

President Joe Biden has said he hopes to include the PRO Act in his infrastructure proposal, thrusting the rhetorical fight over the bill into even greater relief.

Labor leaders had hoped the time was ripe for a major victory in Alabama, amid an economy battered by the coronavirus pandemic, concerns about the growing economic clout of Amazon, and with pro-union Democrats in charge of the White House and Congress, who lent their support. They lost by a wide margin, but now the target is on the back of Right-to-Work states like Alabama, while Pro-union Democrats continue the campaign to change future unionizing efforts at other manufacturing and distribution facilities in the southeast.


