What You Should Know for the 2014-2015 Influenza Season



I am asked every year if a patient should receive influenza vaccine and when should they receive the vaccine. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends a yearly flu vaccine for everyone 6 months of age and older as the first and most important step in protecting against this serious disease. While there are many different flu viruses, the seasonal flu vaccine is designed to protect against the top three or four flu viruses that research indicates will cause the most illness during the flu season. People should begin getting vaccinated soon after flu vaccine becomes available, ideally by October, to ensure that as many people as possible are protected before flu season begins. Patients are encouraged to help protect their loved ones from influenza. Encourage your loved ones to get vaccinated as soon as vaccine becomes


available in their communities. Vaccination is especially important for people at high risk for serious flu complications, and their close contacts.

Children between 6 months and 8 years of age may need two doses of flu vaccine to be fully protected from flu. Your child's healthcare provider can tell you whether two doses are recommended for your child. Children younger than 6 months are at higher risk of serious flu complications, but are too young to get a flu vaccine. Because children younger than 6 months cannot get a vaccine, but are at high risk for serious flu-related complications, safeguarding them from flu is especially important. If you live with or care for an infant younger than 6 months of age, you should get a flu vaccine to help protect them from flu.

In addition to getting vaccinated, you and your loved ones can take everyday preventive steps like staying away from sick people and washing your hands to reduce the spread of germs. If you are sick with flu, stay home from work or school to prevent spreading influenza to others.

If you contract influenza, there are medications that treat it. These medications are called antivirals and can make your illness milder and make you feel better faster. They also can prevent serious flu-related complications, like pneumonia. Of course, health care providers advise seeking medical evaluation and treatment early as these medications are more effective if started early in the disease course. Make sure to discuss obtaining influenza vaccine with your health care provider. Protect yourself and protect your loved ones. Like her husband, Mrs. Stimpson's father, John Richard Miller, Jr. worked in the lumber business; her Mother, Virginia was a stay at home mother. 
